**Course Title:** The Short Story

**Course Description:** This extensive survey of short stories written in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries will explore a variety of genres, examine some major artistic movements, and explain some essential elements of critical inquiry. Students will read stories written by over 25 different authors, including Gogol, Chekhov, Flaubert, Nabokov, Poe, Hawthorne, Melville, Twain, Woolf, Mansfield, Faulkner, Kafka, Fitzgerald, Hemingway, Singer, and O'Connor. Two longer short stories by Henry James ("The Turn of the Screw") and James Joyce ("The Dead") will be examined in detail.
