**Course Title:** New Writing in Canada

**Course Description:** This course features close encounters with Canadian literature published in the last 15 years. We will explore the new voices and forms of Canadian writing, and also consider the ongoing effort to repurpose familiar forms and perennial concerns to new ends. We will study a variety of genres, including poetry, fiction, drama, comics, and a documentary film. Our selection will be guided further by texts that demonstrate an interest in futurity--in speculative, apocalyptic, postnatural, and posthuman possibilities for life and literature.
