Course title: The Short Story

Course Description: Covering works by various writers from the nineteenth century to the present day, this course focuses on a short genre with a short literary history. Looking at the short story as a short genre, we will explore what constitutes a story (a narrative) and what forms, techniques, and subject matter differentiate short fiction from longer fiction. Looking at the short story's short literary history, we will consider the genre's origins in the nineteenth century, its development through the twentieth century, and its adaptations for capturing the new realities of modernity.

First Three Texts/Authors to be Studied: Nathaniel Hawthorne, Edgar Allan Poe, and Stephen King

Method of Instruction: Lecture and discussion
