

#### Director's Notes

Ann-Marie MacDonald's exuberant work Goodnight Desdemona, Good Morning Juliet offers both actors and audiences a fantastic array of elements ranging from the highly stylized to the concrete. This is, at its heart, a play about the difficult road to becoming one's true self. On this road the characters suffer heartfelt loss, the inescapable pull of dreams, and the torment of unrelenting self-examination and criticism. These personalities turn and turn again to show – and discover – different facets of themselves. From some angles they are larger-than-life caricatures, but from others they are grounded, complex, and fully-realized. Unable to see that which is uniquely hers, Constance, the central character, longs to inhabit what she thinks is a better, higher, more desirable self. But even as she complains that she is a cartoon character run over on the highway of life, we can see that she is also capable of great optimism, courage and joy. MacDonald allows all the characters, including the principal casts of *Othello* and *Romeo and Juliet*, ample room in which to be transformed; part of the fun is seeing how drastically these familiar figures change over the course of the play as they move out of their expected places in Shakespeare's text into the anything-can-happen *Goodnight* world.

Ann-Marie MacDonald's play saw its first production in 1988 and its events revolve around an adventurous search for self. Our challenge was how to bring a sense of this adventure and exploration to our production, so we took our inspiration from the decade in which the play was written. The 1980's were formative years for our national identity: we gained our Charter of Rights and Freedoms, patriated our Constitution, and saw the signing of the Canada Act. Terry Fox and Rick Hanson captured the attention of the entire nation as they each took on their own heroic cross-Canada marathons. Mark Garneau was the first Canadian in space, and Sharon Wood of Alberta was the first North American woman to summit Everest. We saw the creation of our own music video station (MuchMusic) and our first million-copy-selling album (Bryan Adams's Reckless). How could we resist the chance to infuse our production with the energy of 80's music, styles and colours? So much was in flux in our world, and Constance's personal journey down the rabbit hole can be seen as a metaphor for the time. We suggest to you, as we would to Constance, that you hang on tight and enjoy the ride.



#### About the Author ...



ANN-MARIE MacDONALD (1958 -) is a Toronto-based writer and actor. Her play Goodnight Desdemona (Good Morning Juliet) won the Governor General's Award for Drama. the Chalmers Award for Outstanding Play and the Canadian Authors' Association Award for Drama. She won a Gemini Award for her role in the film Where the Spirit Lives and was nominated for a Genie for her role in I've Heard the Mermaids Singing. Ann-Marie's first novel Fall on your Knees was selected for the CBC 2010 Canada Reads debate, won the 1997 Commonwealth Prize for Best First Fiction, the 1997 CAA

Harlequin Literary Award for Fiction, the 1997 Dartmouth Book Award, and was shortlisted for the 1996 Giller Prize, the 1997 Trillium Award, the 1997 Chapters/Books in Canada First Novel Award, the Britain's Orange Prize for Best Novel by a woman writer, and the 1997 International IMPAC Dublin Literary Award. Her second novel, *The Way the Crow Flies*, was nominated for the 2003 Giller Prize and won the 2004 Libris Book of the Year Award. Since *Desdemona*, her playwriting has included the librettos for *Nigredo Hotel* and *Anything That Moves*, the black comedy *The Arab's Mouth*, and most recently the sequel to the collective *The Attic, the Pearls and Three Fine Girls*.

He has held the posts of Artistic Director of Dalhousie Theatre Productions in Halifax, Director/Dramaturg of the Music Theatre Writers' Colony at the Muskoka Festival, and Associate Director/Playwright in Residence at the Lighthouse Festival Theatre. Teaching includes Waterloo, Dalhousie, George Brown, Humber, and Gaya College in Malaysia. He is the founding Artistic Director of Theatre Erindale and the founding Sheridan Coordinator of the Theatre and Drama Studies Program (which is now in its twenty-first year). For Theatre Erindale he has directed fifteen plays and designed or adapted several more; for Theatre Sheridan two; and his numerous credits elsewhere include the second production of Midnight Madness, the World Première of The Growing Season, and more new play workshops than he can count.



#### SARAH JANE BURTON (Choreographer & Movement

**Coach**) Ms. Burton coaches actors in period movement and movement that even includes simulating weightlessness in space for the L.A. television series *Odyssey 5*. Her choreography has appeared in over 60 productions in theatres across Ontario, New York, West Africa and in France, where her "special creative

flair" was noted (Rennes). In 1999 SJ received the prestigious Dora Award nomination for Outstanding Choreography in a Play (Toronto).
