# Director's Notes ...

Welcome to the Footlights Club, 1936, New York City. Welcome to the Theatre and Drama Studies Programme, 2012, Mississauga. Time and place may be different, but the situations are very similar. The Footlights Club – an affordable respite and community of a bevy of struggling stage actresses. The Theatre and Drama Programme – a group of aspiring, young actors, striving towards a life on the stage. They share the same ambitions, hopes, optimism, idealism and sometimes fears, bitter disappointments, even despair.

You will meet a delightful menagerie of house residents and their visitors. The authors took the plight of struggling New York actresses so much to heart, that they wrote parts for all of them. They steered away from a linear plot line in favour of a slice of life approach. They created a carnival of characters, often put poignant one-liners into their mouths and we come to know – and care – for each and every one of them. Around the main plot of Terry Randall struggling for a foothold on Broadway, additional microplots spin like little dervishes in the background, each involving wacky, lovable, eccentric characters.

I am always astonished anew, working with the gifted students at Theatre Erindale, of their talent, their work ethics, their commitment. These last few weeks were sheer delight as we shared exploring, discovering and shaping the world of the Footlights Club. Some of the graduating students will soon pound the pavement of the Canadian equivalent of 42nd Street. Third year students will follow on their heels all too soon. Watch closely tonight. Who might go the route of Jean, going to Hollywood and carving out a career in LaLa Land, as so many Canadian performers have done before them. Who will follow Terry, playing leading roles at the Shaw or Stratford Festivals, again as so many graduates of Canadian theatre schools are doing. And who will marry a hometown boy and steer into the safe harbour behind a white picket fence and the country club. I have placed my bets – but I'm not telling!

My best wishes to each and everyone of this large cast of artists. May life give you successful careers and everything else you so richly deserve. I will be rooting for you as will your audience.

Welcome to the Footlights Club. Welcome to Theatre Erindale.

# About the Authors ...

The collaboration between Edna Ferber and George S. Kaufman generated three iconic Broadway plays: *The Royal Family, Dinner at Eight,* and *Stage Door.* 



George S. Kaufman, born in Pittsburgh in 1889, came to the stage through journalism; he took up the post of Drama Editor for the *New York Times* from 1917 to 1930. Not content to critique, he soon found himself writing and directing shows as well. His Broadway premiere was *Someone in the House*, a play that he co-wrote with Larry Evans and Walter Percival, which had a short run of 32 performances before closing

in September 1918. Ever seeking out new partnerships—notably through the 'Algonquin Roundtable', a daily lunch meeting between leaders in NYC's early creative class—it wasn't long before Kaufman had situated himself as one of the top players in New York's theatre scene. He wrote, co-wrote, or directed a show in every Broadway season from 1921 to 1958. Some of his notable successes include the Pulitzer Prize winner *You Can't Take it With You*, which he co-authored in 1936 with Moss Hart, and his 1951 Tony Award winning turn as the original director of *Guys and Dolls*.



Edna Ferber also followed a path from journalism through to drama, though she is often best remembered for her narrative fiction. Born in Kalamazoo, Michigan, in 1885, Ferber worked at both the Milwaukee Journal and the Appleton Daily Crescent before publishing her first novel. She, with Kaufman, was a member of the 'Algonquin Roundtable' and collaborated on a number of projects which still resonate on Broadway. In addition to penning *So Big*, the Pulitzer Prize

winning book, she wrote the novel that inspired the paradigm-busting musical *Show Boat*. She also penned *Cimarron*, the novel that was transformed into an Oscar-winning film in 1930-1931. Most of her work features a strong female lead, with egalitarian and humanist motifs throughout her oeuvre.

Both authors passed away in New York City in the 1960s.

CASSANDRA SILVER (Assistant Director)

Cassandra is a director, stage manager, occasional actor, and perpetual graduate student -- and she's just thrilled to be involved in Stage Door. In the last year, she performed as Avarice in the renaissance drama *New Custom*, stage managed the Toronto premiere of *8 Ways My Mother Was Conceived*, and directed the Silver Cast production of *Pagliacci* with

Opera Lyra at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa. Her Master's thesis, taken at the University of Alberta, explored translations of multilingual drama; her PhD project, which she's currently working on at the University of Toronto, is investigating uses of new media in theatre and performance.

PATRICK YOUNG (Artistic Director, Set Design) graduated in English from Victoria College, University of Toronto, trained in Theatre on a graduate scholarship at Indiana University, and was soon a well-known actor across Canada. His Toronto credits included the record-breaking hits Flicks, The Relapse, and the original production of Automatic Pilot, as well as Chinchilla and the last national tour of Spring Thaw. Elsewhere the range included Misalliance and Threepenny Opera in Boston, Uncle Vanya and Tobacco Road in Indiana, Windsor in Charlottetown, Dames at Sea in Winnipeg, Hay Fever across BC and Scapin across Ontario, plus guest starring on such TV series as The Great Detective and Night Heat. During the 1980s, he branched into playwriting, directing, and teaching. He is the author of the award-winning biographical plays "Winnie" (also filmed for television), Aimee!, and Abigail, or The Gold Medal, plus numerous industrial shows. He has held the posts of Artistic Director of Dalhousie Theatre Productions in Halifax, Director/ Dramaturg of the Music Theatre Writers' Colony at the Muskoka Festival, and Associate Director/Playwright in Residence at the Lighthouse Festival Theatre. Teaching includes Waterloo, Dalhousie, George Brown, Humber, and Gava College in Malavsia. He is the founding Artistic Director of Theatre Erindale and the founding Sheridan Coordinator of the Theatre and Drama Studies Program (which is now in its twenty-first year). For Theatre Erindale he has directed fifteen plays and designed or adapted several more; for Theatre Sheridan two; and his numerous credits elsewhere include the second production of Midnight Madness, the World Première of The Growing Season, and more new play workshops than he can count.



**SARAH JANE BURTON (Choreographer & Movement Coach)** Ms. Burton coaches actors in period movement and movement that

even includes simulating weightlessness in space for the L.A. television series *Odyssey 5*. Her choreography has appeared in over 60 productions in theatres across Ontario, New York, West Africa and in France, where her "special creative flair" was noted (Rennes). In 1999

SJ received the prestigious Dora Award nomination for Outstanding Choreography in a Play (Toronto). She has directed and/or choreographed many musicals such as *Oklahoma*! and *My Fair Lady*, operas such as the COC's co-productions of *The Merry Widow* and *Die Fledermaus*, and for television such as the CBC special *Tamarack on the Rideau*. Formerly a principal actor/dancer on Broadway, Ms. Burton received an Honours B.A. in Dance (Butler University), an M.A. (Wesleyan University), and Certification as a Laban Movement Analyst (New York). She is currently a professor in Theatre and Drama Studies at Sheridan where she also teaches for the Art History, Animation and Performing Arts Preparation programs. SJ has enjoyed coaching and choreographing over twenty productions for Theatre Erindale.

# Direction and Design...



## **HEINAR PILLER (Director)**

Born and educated in Vienna. Mr. Piller became very active in Canadian Theatre after emigrating to Canada. His first major post was Artistic Director of Neptune Theatre in Halifax, followed by the founding of the Grand Theatre Company in London Ontario. After five years under his leadership, The Grand Theatre was termed "the model

regional theatre" by the Canada Council.

He has directed or produced over 200 shows in facilities ranging from the 3000 seat Sonv Centre to small cabaret theatres, for the Canadian Opera Company, the National Arts Centre, The National Theatre School and for many commercial producers, including his own company, Errant Productions Ltd.

He won two Dora Awards for best production of a musical in Toronto for *The Boy* Friend and Man of La Mancha. When he directed 1837, The Farmer's Revolt, the production won a Dora as best production for young audiences.

As an actor Mr. Piller was seen in a principal role in the ACTRA Award winning CBC film Charlie Grant's War. He also appeared in principal roles in feature films such as Sum of all Fears and TV series, such as Nightheat and Street Legal, as well as a continuing role in the daytime drama Family Passion.

For eleven years, Heinar Piller was Chair of Performing Arts at George Brown College in Toronto. During his tenure, the George Brown Theatre School moved into the forefront of professional theatre training in Canada.

He has since directed several musicals and operas, notably an acclaimed production of a contemporary opera *Tartuffe* for the Maryland Opera Studio and a grand scale production of La Traviata for the University of Michigan. He directed Aeschylus' The Libation Bearers, Shakespeare's Love's Labours Lost and Ybsens Pillars of Society for Theatre Erindale and the world premiere of a new play Cricket and Claudette for the Blyth Festival. At Dalhousie University he directed Into The Woods as well as a production of the contemporary interpretation of Ovid's Metamorphoses by Mary Zimmerman. The entire action takes place in and around a swimming pool, which had to be constructed on stage. The Halifax Chronical Herald said: "... Heinar Piller giving the whole production his own magic touch, which transforms everything in this ensembleacting coup de theatre into pure gold."



## **DEVON HEALEY (Assistant Director)**

Devon graduated from the UTM/Sheridan College Theatre and Drama Studies program in 2010. She has since graduated from the University of Toronto's Teachers College (OISE) in 2011 and is the Co-Founder of Follies and Foils, a theatre and education company. In its first year, Follies and Foils has been working in the private, public and separate

school boards in addition to presenting at the Council of Ontario for Drama and Dance in Education. Devon has also been busy in and around Toronto, playing Corrie Bratter -Barefoot in the Park as well as doing a promotion for the film The Immortals. Some UTM theatre highlights include, Maria - Taming of the Tamer and Olive Rappalo - A New Life.
