WHY U OF T MISSISSAUGA?

The University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM) offers you all the benefits of a U of T degree with the rewards of studying at a small, intimate campus. At UTM, you are surrounded by 225 acres of protected green space with access to all of the resources of the University of Toronto.

WHEN CAN I START?

The University of Toronto Mississauga admits students only to the Fall-Winter session, beginning in September.

1. Submit an online application at www.ouac.on.ca (**choose the “105” application**).
2. Submit required documentation to: Enrolment Services, University of Toronto, 172 St. George St., Toronto, ON, M5R 0A3. The university needs your full transcript from high school as well as transcripts from any colleges or universities you have attended. They can be sent directly from your high school and/or college/university through the Ontario Universities’ Application Centre (OUAC) for a fee.

WHEN IS THE APPLICATION DEADLINE?

WHICH UTM PROGRAMS CAN I TAKE?

The agreement between UTM and Sheridan College is intended for students interested in pursuing studies in:

- Communication, Culture, Information and Technology;
- Humanities;
- Social Sciences; or
- Visual Studies

You may apply to other areas of study, but you must ensure you have the necessary prerequisites and meet the minimum grade requirements. Please see the U of T Mississauga Viewbook for details.

WHAT ARE THE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS?

Commerce, Life Sciences, Management, Theatre & Drama	Minimum CGPA of 3.3
All other programs	Minimum CGPA of 3.0

- Prerequisite courses vary by program.
- UTM accepts high school Grade 12 U courses or two full college semesters of an academic subject as prerequisites. Two semesters of college math will meet Advanced Functions requirements. Where Calculus & Vectors is required, one of the two semesters of college math **must** be calculus.

SHERIDAN COLLEGE TO UTM COURSE EQUIVALENCIES CHART

You must achieve a minimum of 60% in each Sheridan College course to have it transfer. Also, in order to receive the full benefit of the transfer agreement, you must complete the 2-year General Arts & Science diploma program. You will receive a min/max of 5.0 credits (towards a 20.0 credit U of T degree) provided you meet the former requirement. If we cannot award you credit for established equivalencies, we will consider additional electives for generic transfer credit.
