## Work Study

The University of Toronto offers a Work Study program; faculty and staff can hire students for work integrated learning opportunities. The University pays 70% of the wages and faculty/staff provide opportunities to build their skills, develop knowledge and explore how their academic studies translate to career possibilities.
