

#### ART & ART HISTORY PROGRAM

The Art & Art History program combines the study of Art History at UTM with studio art courses at Sheridan College and is the longest standing partnership of its type in Canada.

In your initial two years of study, you'll discover a range of approaches to visual expression by completing problem-based assignments in six core studios: drawing, painting, sculpture/installation, print media, design, and photography. In the upper-level studios, you will deepen your expertise in two of the core studio streams and develop a body of artwork in an environment of open discussion and exchange.

In your Art History courses, you'll learn how to analyze works of art and architecture while exploring a wide range of materials, techniques, and settings. You'll study innovative artists, past and current controversies over images, and the role of art within diverse historical and political contexts. Courses span the history of art from the ancient to the contemporary

worlds, across Europe, the Americas, Africa, and Asia.

You'll graduate with a portfolio and two prestigious and practical credentials that reflect the program's dual focus: an Honours Bachelor of Arts from the University of Toronto and a Diploma in Art and Art History from Sheridan College.
