Duties:

All normal duties related to the design and teaching of a university credit course, including preparation and delivery of course content, development, administration and marking of assignments, tests, and exams, calculations and submission of grades, holding regular office hours and supervision of any teaching assistants assigned to the course. The mode of instruction for the courses is in-person unless indicated. Candidate must travel to UTM to perform duties.

Minimum Qualifications:

Candidates must be in a graduate degree program at the University of Toronto with a PhD in progress and nearing completion or at least a Master's degree and background in a relevant field.

Preferred Qualifications:

PhD in progress and nearing completion preferred. Evidence of ongoing program of research and pedagogy related to course themes. Ability to meet deadlines and work well under time constraints are required.

Relevant Criterion:

The need to acquire experience is the more relevant criterion than previous experience in respect of the posted positions.
