Before you arrive

 \checkmark Think about your future goals and what you aim to achieve during your time at UTM

✓ Research the Canadian job market (employers, sectors and markets)

✓ Prepare your resume and LinkedIn profile

During your studies

✓ Get your <u>Social Insurance Number</u> (SIN). A Sin is required to work and be paid in Canada.

✓ Book an <u>appointment</u> with an Immigration Advisor and discuss the requirements to work on or off campus. Working during your studies is a good way to get Canadian work experience and build your networking.

✓ Book an <u>appointment</u> with a Career Counsellor and Employment Strategist International to develop and showcase your skills and get support with your job search, network strategy, mock interviews, etc.

✓ Consider volunteering! <u>Volunteering</u> is a great way to develop your employability skills while making a difference to local communities.

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During your studies (cont'd)

✓ Participate in <u>Work Study Program</u> at U of T. The program offers a variety of paid, meaningful positions supervised by U of T faculty and staff.

✓ Perfect your job application skills by attending tailored workshops and sessions covering resume and cover letter critique, interview technics, networking and more.

✓ Network! <u>Networking</u> is very important part of your job search. Understand the importance of networking and start building connections with the help of an employment strategist or participating in networking event and panels.

✓ Participate in International Student Training Employment Program (ISTEP) that will train you for finding jobs in Canada after graduation.

Before graduation

✓ Search for jobs opportunities and apply. You may want to check what jobs qualify for Permanent Residency in Canada by searching the National Occupational Classification Code (NOC)

✓ Continue preparing for job applications and interviews by attending workshops and sessions covering resume and cover letters writing, networking and interview techniques or book an one-on-one appointment with the Employment Strategist International for resume critiques, mock interviews, offers and negotiations strategy.

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Before graduation

✓ Learn from any rejection. Be resilient and make the most of any rejections as a learning experience. Seek on-on-ne appointments with the Career Counsellor or Employment Strategist International for personalized support.

After graduation

✓ Apply for the proper <u>work permit</u> if you intend to stay and work in Canada. Check with an IEC Immigration Advisor if you meet the requirements to apply, how and when to apply.
✓ Continue accessing UTM Career Supports up to 2 years after graduation and UTM Immigration Advising for Permanent Residency in Canada up to 3 years after graduation.

✓ Give back and share your experience. Share your career journey, experience and knowledge with fellow students, contributing to their success.

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
