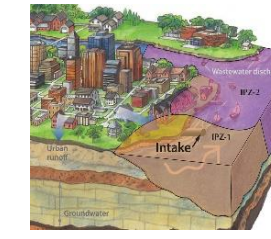

Creation of SPPB (Nested under the Drinking Water Management Division)

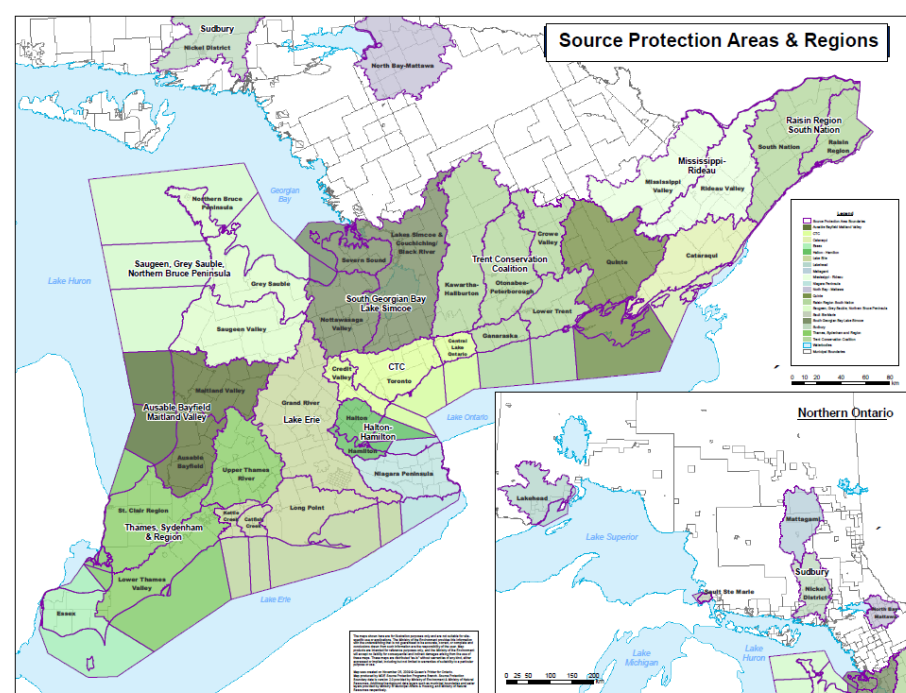
Ontario investment of over \$250 million

Addressing risks to water resources through the creation and implementation of 22 local Source Protection Plans (Final Approved December, 2015)



Policy and Programs Assistant

- Coordination and facilitation of qualitative research and analysis for Program Framework Review
- Creation of Government Review Team summaries
- Analysis of the Assessment Reports and use of various terminology and definition of storm-water management facilities
- Data collection and summary of scoped methodologies in pilot projects outside of the Source Protection Regions
- Restructuring and standardization of the completed Environmental Compliance Approvals (ECAs) data for the process of secondary screening
- Utilization of Ministry's tools (i.e. mapping tool, Integrated Divisional System (IDS), and etc.)
- Secondary screening of new ECA applications and existing ECA files
