A LinkedIn group for youth to find entry-level green jobs and networking opportunities. The GCC posts opportunities on the daily.



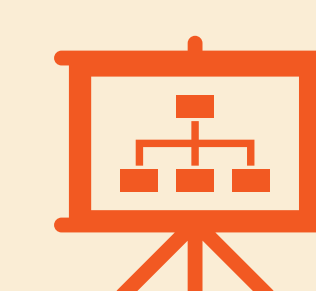
Main Projects & Contributions
