The Matrix system:

- ☑ Easy to read
- ☑ Summarizes key information
- ☑ Shows connections and comparisons between different concepts
- ☑ Can be hard to use during lectures

How it works

1. Organize the information using headings

Create tables or charts to separate information under different headings.

2. Design your tables to highlight comparisons and connections

You don't have to make everything a T-table. Consider making a 2 x 2 table to highlight the features of two groups within two traits.
